**O**pal Lance Anderson Poteete, age 95, of Marietta died Saturday, September 1, 2007. She was a riveter at Bell Bomber during WWII, retired from Rich's in downtown Atlanta, and was a member of Concord Baptist Church.

Ms. Poteete was born in Blairsville March 18, 1912, to Thomas and Mary Lance. She attended Mt. Zion School. Ms. Poteete married John Anderson July 9, 1946. They had one daughter, Patricia Ann.
