I have a particularly fond memory of Ms. Dedeaux, not only because she was a great teacher in a general way but because she took risks and challenged students. In the first few weeks of the course, she required us to write a report and give a presentation on it. She asked us to have the contents of the report on note cards so that she could grade the report while we went up and stood at the front of the class to give our presentation. Guess what? I wrote the report but forgot to create the note cards! When it came to be my turn to speak, she took the report from me refusing to allow my use of it for the presentation. I felt that I was doomed, and my fellow students were horrified over what might happen next. I don't know if she knew that I could handle it or not, but I went up there and nailed it. For a love of the subject of the report and I suppose by remaining calm, I was able to recall each paragraph of the report in order and recite most of it from memory. I spoke for a good ten minutes. Everyone was shocked, me most of all! Ms. Dedeaux was impressed and gave me a 100

on the report and congratulated me.
